

## **POSER #4**

### Section 3 Rule 7 – Spotting Colours

1. A colour has to be spotted after being potted and its own spot is occupied. Where is it spotted? – **Highest available spot**
2. What if all spots are occupied? - **As close to its own spot as possible, between its spot and the nearest part of the top cushion**
3. What about Pink and Black, assuming all spots are occupied, and there is no room between their own spots and the nearest part of the top cushion? **As close to its own spot as possible, on the centre line of the table below its Spot.**
4. Black and Brown are to be spotted, but the Brown spot is the only vacant spot. Which ball goes where? – **Brown on its own spot – Black as in Q2 – Please note this rule reference Section 3 Rule 7 (i) a colour, to be properly spotted, must be placed by hand on the spot designated in the rules.**
5. Black and Brown again have to be spotted and both their spots are occupied, but the Blue spot is vacant. Which ball goes where this time? - **Black spotted on the Blue spot. Brown as near its own spot as possible, as described in Q2.**
6. This time Black and Brown again have to be spotted and both their spots are occupied, but the Pink and Blue spots are vacant. Where are the balls spotted now? - **Black spotted on the Pink spot. Brown spotted on the Blue spot.**
